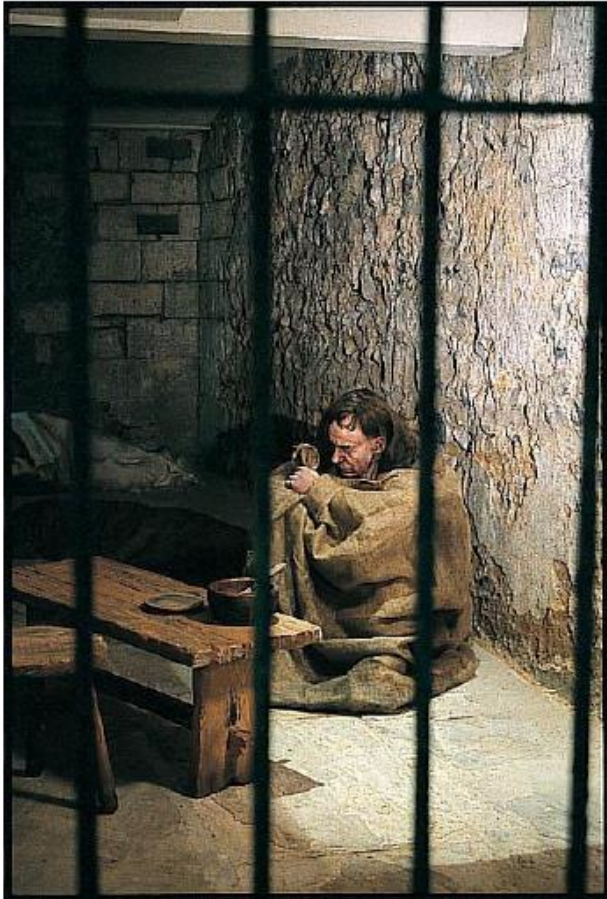


Medieval cell and graffiti

This first image shows a reconstruction medieval prison cell, formerly at Norwich Castle. The cell includes a model of a prisoner sitting under some original medieval prisoners' graffiti.



This second image is of a stone from Norwich Castle. The stone was probably carved in the 13th or 14th century, and is the earliest direct evidence of a named prisoner here. The text is in Norman French, and simply says: 'Bartholomew, truly wrongfully and without reason, I am shut in this prison.'
